California Digital Library

metadata (a single online catalog for all the libraries and archives in the university system); publishing (e-books in collaboration with the University of California Press); an institutional digital repository (for various digital resources created and used by the university faculties); a regional digital archives (the online archives of California, serving repositories throughout the state); web archiving (harvesting state government web sites and data); as well as curriculum for primary and secondary schools

1997

National Digital Infrastructure and Information Preservation Program

- Formed in 2000
- App. US\$100 million total budget
- “Develop a national strategy to collect, archive and preserve the burgeoning amounts of digital content, especially materials that are created only in digital formats, for current and future generations”

Minnesota NDIIPP project

- Partners: CA, IL, KS, MS, TN, VT, California Digital Library, National Council of State Legislatures, private companies (Thomson Reuters)
- Budget: US\$723,000
- “Collect, preserve and provide access to at-risk digital content from state legislatures”
